1. EU passport photo	The passport photograph has to be 35 millimetres wide and 45 millimetres high. You can find the exact dimensions here: www.bmi.gv.at/passbild .
2. Signature	You have to sign directly in front of the employee of the Austrian authority or Austrian embassy.
3.	You are not allowed to write anything here.

Application for a documentation	You may only check <u>ONE box</u> here.
4. registration certificate	You tick here if you are an EEA or Swiss citizen and apply for a certificate of registration.
5. photo identity card for EEA nationals	You tick here if you apply for a photo ID for EEA citizens.
6. residence card for relatives of EEA nationals	You tick here if you are a third-country national (not an EEA or Swiss citizen) and apply for a residence card.
7. certificate of permanent residence	You tick here if you are an EEA or Swiss citizen and apply for a certificate of permanent residence for EEA citizens.
8. permanent residence card for relatives of EEA nationals	You tick here if you are a third-country national (not an EEA or Swiss citizen) and apply for a permanent residence card.

What documents do you need for the application?

You are an EEA citizen or Swiss citizen and apply for a registration certificate?

Then you need:

- a valid identity card OR
- a valid passport
- AND
- documents to show why you want to continue living in Austria.

Depending on what you marked under **Point B** you will need the following documents.

You marked (35) **Employee**? Then you will also need:

- a work contract or
- a confirmation of engagement from the employer.

You marked (35) **Self-employed**? Then you will also need:

- proof that you are self-employed.

For example: a work contract, fee notes, your income tax assessment for the last year.

You marked (37) **Private individual / non-employed person**? Then you will also need:

- proof that you have comprehensive sickness insurance cover in Austria
- proof that you have sufficient resources for yourself and your family members for your planned stay in Austria.

You can show sufficient resources through your income or savings. For example your pension.

You marked (38) **pupil/student (education)**? Then you will also need:

- proof of enrolment at an establishment accredited or financed by Austria
- proof that you have comprehensive sickness insurance cover in Austria
- proof that you have sufficient resources

You marked (39) **family member**?

As husband, wife or registered partner you also need:

- a wedding certificate or certificate on your registered partnership.

As a child or grandchild under the age of 21 you also need:

- a document to prove a family relationship.

If you want to prove that a person is related to you, you need to bring a confirmation. This is, for example, a birth certificate or adoption certificate.

As a life partner in a durable relationship you will also need:

- proof of a durable relationship with a EEA citizen or Swiss citizen.

As another family member you also need:

- proof that you are receiving maintenance from the EEA citizen or Swiss citizen in your country of origin. That means you have to show that you are getting money or other assistance from a EEA citizen or Swiss citizen covering your basic needs OR
- proof that you have lived together with the EEA citizen or Swiss citizen in the same household in your country of origin OR
- proof of the existence of serious health grounds which strictly require the personal care of the family member by the EEA citizen or Swiss citizen

- a valid passport

You marked (39) **family member**?

As husband, wife or registered partner you also need:

- a wedding certificate or certificate on your registered partnership.

As a child or grandchild under the age of 21 you also need:

- a document to proof a family relationship.

If you want to prove that a person is related to you, you need to bring a confirmation. This is, for example, a birth certificate or adoption certificate.

As a child or grandchild above the age of 21 you also need:

- a document attesting to the existence of a family relationship.

- proof that you need maintenance AND

You are an EEA citizen or Swiss citizen and apply for a certificate of permanent residence?

Then you need

- a valid identity card

OR

a valid passport

- a proof that you have lived in Austria for the last 5 years and that you are still living in Austria
- a proof that your reason of residence in the last 5 years was as follows (several points are possible):
 - employee/employee
 - self-employed
 - private individual / non-employed person
 - pupil or student (education)
 - family member

Evidence includes employment contracts, income tax returns, school reports, enrollment confirmations, bank statements, marriage certificate, partnership certificate or birth certificate.

Are you a third-country national applying for a permanent residence card?

Then you need

- a valid identity card
- OR
- a valid passport
- a proof that you have lived in Austria for the last 5 years and that you are still living in Austria
- Proof that you have been a family member of an EEA citizen or Swiss citizen for the last 5 years.

You can find more information about the family members on pages 6 and 7.

ATTENTION:

Even if you have already submitted all the listed documents, the authority may still require more information/documents from you. This may be necessary if not everything is clear for the authority yet. Therefore, please send these documents to the authority quickly.

If you do not pay the fees, you cannot get a residence permit. Please pay the fees as soon as possible. If you pay later, your procedure will take longer.
