

## Explanation of the application form

### Settlement Permit - Dependent

This explanation was intentionally written in easily understandable language.

This explanation is for your information only. Only the law published in German language is legally valid and binding. This means that you cannot derive any rights from this explanation.

**You may only tick one box under "Application for a residence permit".**

<b>1. EU passport photo</b>	The passport photograph has to be 35 millimetres wide and 45 millimetres high. You can find the exact dimensions here: <a href="http://www.bmi.gv.at/passbild">www.bmi.gv.at/passbild</a> .
<b>2. Signature</b>	You have to sign directly in front of the employee of the Austrian authority or Austrian embassy.
<b>3.</b>	You are not allowed to write anything here.
<b>Type of application      You may only tick one application type (= one box) here.</b>	
<b>4. Initial application</b>	Tick this box if you currently do not have a residence permit for Austria.
<b>5. Extension application</b>	Tick this box if your residence permit is still valid and you are already holding the right purpose for your stay and you want to renew it. The purpose of your stay is for example your studies at a university or family reunification. You can apply when there are only 3 months left until your residence permit expires.
<b>6. Application for change of purpose</b>	Tick this box if your residence permit is still valid and you want to stay in Austria for a different purpose than the one you currently have. If you do not get the other purpose of residence, you will again get the same purpose of residence as before, if it is no longer valid. However, you must meet all the requirements for this.
<b>7. Extension application/Application for change of purpose</b>	Tick this box if you want to continue staying in Austria for a different purpose than the one you currently have AND you want to renew your residence permit if your change of purpose is denied. In this case, you will have to pay double the application fee.

22. health insurance that is compulsory in Austria and covers all risks	Do you have health insurance? Please write down the name. The health insurance must be valid in Austria and cover all risks.

#### 1. property/assets

<b>66. type of assets (savings book, account)</b>	What kind of income/property do you have (e.g. a bank account, regular income from renting out a house)?
<b>67. height (EUR)</b>	How much is your income/property worth in euros?
<b>68. Where does the money come from (e.g. savings, parents' income)?</b>	Where did you get the money (for example, savings, parents' income)? Who provided you with the money (name, date of birth, nationality, close relationship)?
<b>69. The money belongs only to me (or the person specified in point 54) and I do not have to share it with anyone else</b>	<b>yes</b> – Please tick here, if you have to share the money with somebody other than your husband or your wife. <b>no</b> – Please tick here, if you have to share the money with somebody.

#### 2. income (e.g. salary, wages or other claims such as maintenance)

<b>70. type</b>	Do you have a job or another form of regular income? Do you receive maintenance? Maintenance means that somebody has to give you money every month, e.g. after a divorce.
<b>71. monthly amount (EUR)</b>	How much money do you get per month in euros? Income and maintenance are included.

#### 3. declaration of liability

This is a written statement by a person who is responsible for your accommodation and financial support in Austria. The person must also pay for the costs incurred by a territorial authority if, for example, you do

not leave Austria voluntarily despite a return decision, expulsion or a residence ban. A territorial authority is, for example, the federal government, state or municipality.

The declaration of liability is valid for five years and must be certified by an Austrian notary or domestic court.

The declaration of liability is possible with:

- "Settlement Permit – Artist"
- "Settlement Permit" according to § 56 NAG
- "Residence Permit – Pupil"
- "Residence Permit – Student"

The declaration of liability is mandatory for:

"Settlement Permit – Dependent"

"Stay Permit – Volunteers"

## Which documents do you need for the application?

- Valid travel document, e.g. a passport.
- Photo of yourself (see point 1 of this explanation).
- A document stating whether you have been convicted by a court. You can get this document for example from the police or from a court in your home country.

You only need this document for the initial application.

- Certificate of marriage or a partner certificate, if that applies.
- Document about your divorce or dissolution of your registered partnership, if that applies.
- Proof or document of relationship.  
If you want to prove that a person is related to you, you must bring a confirmation. This is, for example, a birth certificate or an adoption certificate. Proof or document about the family relationship
- Death certificate, if that applies.
- Proof about sufficient health insurance in Austria.
- Proof to a locally customary accommodation.  
For example your housing agreement (Wohnrechtsvereinbarung), rental contract or proof of ownership of an apartment or house.
- Proof that you have sufficient income.  
For example a work contract, a pay slip or a confirmation that you receive a pension. It may also be a proof that you own property.
- Proof that you have already learned German at the simplest level (A1).  
You only need this evidence for the first application. Exceptions apply for e.g. children under the age of 14 or persons who have completed secondary education (equivalent of Austrian "Reifeprüfung").

For a settlement permit – relative a sponsor is necessary in any case. A sponsor is an Austrian citizen who lives in Austria and wants to bring someone from his or her family to Austria.

As a **relative** you also need to submit in any case:

- a liability declaration by your sponsor.

There are different possibilities how a sponsor can bring you to Austria.

### Possibility 1

Are you the mother or father, the grandmother or grandfather of the sponsor? Or of the sponsor's spouse or registered partner?

Then you need

- Proof by the sponsor that he or she covers your basic needs and provides you maintenance payments.

### **Possibility 2**

Are you the live partner of the sponsor (but you are not married or in a registered partnership)?

Then you need

- Proof that you are in a long-term relationship with your sponsor
- Proof by the sponsor that he or she covers your basic needs and provides you maintenance payments.

### **Possibility 3**

Are you another relative? This means that you are related to the sponsor.

For example you are his or her sister or brother, aunt or uncle or you are cousins.

Then you need

- Proof by the sponsor that he or she covers your basic needs and provides you maintenance payments OR
- proof that you have lived in the same household with the sponsor in your country OR
- proof that you are seriously ill and the sponsor has to take care of you

#### **ATTENTION:**

**Even if you have already submitted all the listed documents, the authority may still require more information/documents from you. This may be necessary if not everything is clear for the authority yet. Therefore, please send these documents to the authority quickly.**

**If you do not pay the fees, you cannot get a residence permit. Please pay the fees as soon as possible. If you pay later, your procedure will take longer.**
