Please note the **official language** of Austria is **German**. The authority will do its best to communicate in English but for legally binding declarations you will have to use the German language.

<b>D. Closing statement</b>
<p>1. <b>I have entered all the information correctly.</b> I have not intentionally misrepresented anything. I am aware that all relevant documents must be presented in person at the time of application. I have provided all the relevant documents I have. <b>If the authority requests translations</b>, I have to <b>provide</b> them in <b>German</b>.</p> <p>If a document is not in German or English, it is recommended to have my documents translated before applying. Then the authority can work faster.</p> <p>2. <b>I have to provide my address.</b> The authority sends all letters to this address. If this address changes, I have to report this to the authority immediately. For example when I move. If the authority is repeatedly unable to deliver a letter to me, it will discontinue my application. Then I will not get a residence permit!</p> <p>I can also specify an authorized recipient. The authority then sends my letters to this person. What an authorized recipient is can be found on page 1 under <i>authorized representative</i>.</p> <p><b>If any of the information on this form changes, I must report this to the authority immediately!</b> I have to do this in writing. I also have to send all relevant documents.</p> <p>3. <b>If I provide wrong information or if I don't provide all relevant information, it's possible that I will not get a residence permit! It is also possible that the authority will not extend my residence permit.</b> This can also happen if I do not follow all points of this closing statement.</p> <p>4. I am not allowed to marry anyone just to get a residence permit! I am not allowed to enter into a registered partnership with anyone just to get a residence permit! I am not allowed to arrange a marriage or registered partnership for anyone just so that they can get a residence permit or a documentation.</p> <p>I am not allowed to adopt anyone just to get a residence permit! No one can adopt me just to get a residence permit. I am not allowed to arrange an adoption just so that someone gets a residence permit.</p>

**These marriages, registered partnerships and adoptions are punishable by law!** That means I will be charged. I may have to pay a fine or go to jail.

**It is also punishable if I give false information in order to get a residence permit!**

5. If I commit an **administrative offense**, I have to pay a **fine of at least 50 Euros and up to 250 Euros**.
- I have to immediately inform the authority if the purpose of my stay changes. I am only allowed to do what is related to the purpose of my stay.
  - I have to hand in documentation that is no longer valid to the authority.
  - I have to immediately report to the authority if someone has stolen my documentation, if I have lost it or if the documentation has become damaged. I also have to report immediately if my data changes. For example, if I get married and have a different name.
  - If my family circumstances change, I have to report this to the authority after one month at the latest. For example, if I get married or get divorced.

**I am committing an administrative offense if I do not comply with the statements in point 5.**

### E. What do you do if you want to extend your “Article 50 EUV” residence permit?

If you have a residence permit "Article 50 EUV" with a validity period of 5 years, you can already apply for the extension up to 3 months before the expiry of the validity period of your residence permit.

If you acquire a permanent right of residence before the expiry of your "Article 50 EUV" card, you can apply for an extension earlier - i.e. from the time you acquire the permanent right of residence. However, an extension at a later point in time does not harm your right of residence.

If you have already acquired a permanent right of residence, the residence title is valid for 10 years. Then you should also apply for an extension of the card in 10 years. The permanent right of residence itself is unlimited.

**Please set a reminder in your calendar so that you always have up-to-date proof of your right of residence.**
